All Our Days

Psalm 90

Moses wrote this psalm near the end of a long wilderness journey, contemplating the brevity of human life and the eternality of God. His perspective of man's time on earth is summed up in verse 6. In the morning it flourishes, and grows up; in the evening it is cut down, and withers. "HAPPY NEW YEAR," somehow does not appear in that statement.

III. The INTERCESSION of Moses (12-17)
