Two Kinds of Wisdom Literature

1.Proverbial Wisdom PROVERBS

What is a biblical proverb?

A short saying that summarizes the rule of life for those who would follow God's blessed path.

When there are many words, transgression is unavoidable;

But he who restrains his lips is wise.

The righteous should choose his friends carefully,

For the way of the wicked leads them astray.

Hear, my children, the instruction of a father,

Qoheleth

"Cynical Wisdom"

"Vanity of vanities," says Qoheleth,

"Vanity of vanities! All is vanity."

Ecclesiastes 1:2

Exactly as a man is born, thus will he die. So what advantage to him who toils for the wind?

Ecclesiastes 5:16

Money is the answer to everything.

Ecclesiastes 10:19

Indeed, if a man should live many years, let him rejoice in them all, and let him remember the days of darkness, for they shall be many. Everything that is come will be futility.

Ecclesiastes 11:8

Ecclesiastes 8:14

The Message of Ecclesiastes

For God has so worked that *men* should fear Him. (3:14)

Rather, fear God. (5:7)

...for the *one who fears God* comes forth.... (7:18)

The Message of Ecclesiastes

I know that it is well with those who *fear God*, who fear Him openly. (8:12)

The Message of Ecclesiastes

The conclusion, when all has been heard, is: fear God and keep His commandments, because this applies to every person. (12:13)

1. Consider the literature as a whole, not in parts.

2. Read the literature for the "sense" of what the author is saying, recognizing symbolic language.

3. Follow the line of argument. Allow yourself to be led along to the conclusion.

4. Read with adequate time for reflection, realizing that the full meaning is not always readily apparent.

5. As in all Bible reading, read prayerfully and submissively, allowing the Holy Spirit to minister to you.
