The Word Became Flesh 3 – Hebrews 2:5-18 Greg Stiekes, Pastor

In Hebrews chapter 2, He who was "so much *better* than the angels" (1:4) is now "made a little *lower* than the angels" (2:9). This statement is a reference to the humanity of Christ, leaving the author of Hebrews to explain the purpose of the incarnation. Why did the Son of God have to become a human being? Chapter 2 provides us with at least four answers:

- 1. So that He could *die for* us (2:9).
- 2. So that He could *identify with* us (2:10-13).
 - a. Purpose of His identification-bringing sons to glory.
 - b. Perfection of His identification-through suffering.
 - c. Extent of His identification-not ashamed to call us brethren.

- 3. So that He could *deliver* us (2:14-16).
 - a. From the *prince* of death (14)
 - b. From the *power* of death (14)
 - c. From the *fear* of death (15)
